From the Spiritual Director - - - JJ Bodine

WHO . . . and HOW?

At the center of the three Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke) is a section of Jesus' story which begins with the Transfiguration, then moves to a scene in which Jesus asks the disciples, "Who are people saying that I am?" They respond with several possibilities – to which Jesus then says, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter, that impetuous spokesman for the twelve, immediately jumps in with, "You are the Anointed One, the Messiah, the Christ of God!" and Jesus blesses his unearthly insight. But then, without taking a breath, Jesus speaks of his impending suffering and death to be followed by his being raised from death. Peter takes Jesus aside to "rebuke" him – that is, to say that Jesus has it all wrong. But Jesus then "rebukes" Peter, naming the apostle as "Satan!" and putting Peter in his place – behind Jesus. What follows is Jesus' declaration that those who would follow Jesus, the Christ, must be willing to let go of what has, by common sense, been significant—including life itself—taking up their cross and following him.

We're all familiar with these central passages in the gospels; but sometimes we seem to be more willing to say just who Jesus is, without pausing to consider how we are saying it. Who Jesus is—Savior, Redeemer, Christ and all the rest—is an important way of speaking our trust in him. But how we say this trust is equally significant, as Jesus' words about discipleship suggest. Sometimes, I fear, HOW we say it outshouts WHO Jesus is—when we seek to keep our feet planted securely in the present circumstance by dwelling on our understanding without translating that understanding into clear actions (the HOW) of discipleship; when we stress "correct or true" words at the expense of truth-demonstrating actions. (Didn't Jesus also speak of many who said "Lord, Lord" but were rejected nonetheless?). The gospels' placement of Jesus' words on what discipleship, following him, means in terms of living out trust in him as the Savior—letting go, sacrifice, cross-bearing, and the rest—strongly connects the HOW we say WHO Jesus is and why we invite others to join with us.

HOW do *you* say **WHO** Jesus is?

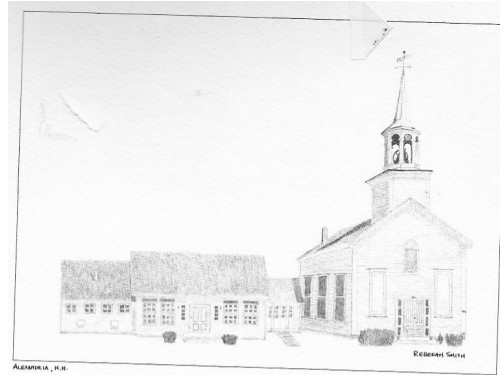

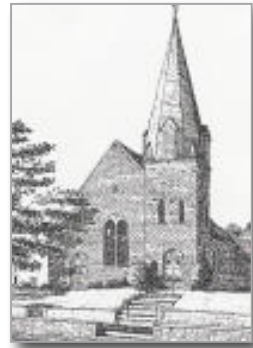
May 16, 2009: Alexandria United Methodist Church

Take II-93 to Exit 23
West on Rte 104/Rte 132. Go 5.9 miles.
Continue on Lake Street/Rte 3A 0.4 miles
Turn Left at Bristol Hill Road. Go 1.1
miles
Turn Left at Plumer Road. Go 0.8 miles
Slight Left at Thissell Road. Go 0.4 miles
Turn Right at Town Pond Road. Go 0.7
miles
Continue on Washburn Road for 121 feet.



June 20, 2009 West Congregational Church

Take Rt. 93 to Exit 15W, to N. Main Street/N. State Street
(Rt. 3). Turn north on Rt. 3. Go for approx. 2.5 miles. The
church is on your left, approx. 1 mile past the NH State
Prison. Parking in the rear of the church. Secuela is in the
old parish hall, the building on the left.

From West, North and South: Take Rt. 93 to exit 3, Rt. 111 Take Rt. 111
East to Rt. 121A North. (This is at the Hannaford's Supermarket) (Not Rt.
121) Turn left onto Rt. 121A North

* Continue on Rt. 121A North for $\frac{3}{4}$ mile to Pillsbury Road on Left.

(Angle Pond Campground sign)

* Turn Left onto Pillsbury Road.

* Go $\frac{4}{10}$ mile to intersection of Pillsbury Road and Odd Fellows Road.

* Go Straight on Odd Fellows road.

* At the cul-de-sac there is a new road which is an extension of Odd
Fellows Road. Continue on the new road.

* Go approx. $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to Cottage Road on Right.

* Go to end of Cottage Road and look for sign for 33 Cottage Road.

* Park in front of garage.

From East.

* Take Rt. 125 to Rt. 111 West.

* Continue on Rt. 111 West to Rt. 121A. (This is at the Hannaford's
Supermarket)

* Turn right onto Rt. 121A North.

* Continue above directions at **A)**
